

OPERATING OUR HORSE RESCUE

What happens in a week at Equi-Venture?

- Daily health checks and record keeping take up **30 hours per week.**
- Feeding, haying and watering requires a minimum of **66 hours per week.**
- Mucking and cleaning up the stable consumes **75 hours per week.**
- Basic horse care needs being met takes at least **70 hours per week.**
- Farm maintenance requires **40 hours per week.**
- Training and reschooling horses consumes over **140 hours per week.**
- Feed and supplies transportation takes about **6 hours per week.**
- Administrative office work takes at least **40 hours per week.**
- Training volunteers and staff will consume about **10 hours per week.**
- Lessons, workshops, clinics, courses and stable activities can take over **58 hours per week.**
- Day camp sessions, if in session, will consume another **50 hours per week.**

What else happens during the month at Equi-Venture?

- Veterinarian and farrier appointments consumes about **12 hours each month.**
- Monthly weight recordings and body scorings will take **at least 4 hours each month.**
- Open house, camps, social events, and public programs take **over 60 hours per month.**
- Fundraising events prep, planning and enactment can demand **50 hours each month.**
- Promotion of the farm and mission will take at least another **30 hours each month.**
- Checking out potential rescue horses and transportation of them takes **at least 30 hours each month.**

NOTE: One snowstorm, severe weather or a sick horse throws countless more hours onto what is an almost impossible schedule to maintain. But we persevere FOR THE HORSES.
